



The Pentatonic Minor scale is The #1 most important scale you need to know as a serious guitarist. This simple book will help you learn all FIVE positions of this scale. I've given you each box position (sometimes called, "Movable Pattern") and the tab.

NOTE: The five box positions are NOT new scales. They are different ways of playing the SAME scale. There are only five differnt notes in the Pentatonic scale. So, these patterns are just repeating the same notes (in different octaves) along the fretboard.

The tab is written in G Pentatonic Minor.

The fretboard pattern shows you how the scale looks on the fretboard.

IMPORTANT: The fretboard pattern can be moved to any starting note. The first note of Box 1 will determine which key you're in. So, if you start Box 1 on G (6th string, 3rd fret) you're in the key of G. If you start on A (6th string, 5th fret) you're in they key of A

minor. And so on and so forth.

The Pentatonic Minor is critical for blues and rock.
