Pivot Chord Secrets

A Pivot Note is a note (or sometimes multiple notes) that two different chords have in common.

Pivot notes are played with the same finger in the exact same spot between two successive chords in a progression.

Fingers playing pivot notes will not move with the rest of the fingers when you change chords.

A chord progression may have one or more pivot notes (or none).

You can easily find pivot notes in tab by looking for two chords that share the same string and fret.

Always look for pivot notes in your chord progressions to make changing chords faster and easier!
